127		<p>From: Executive Board: This conference approves the re-appointment of Le Groupe de Gestion, as the auditor of ILGA for 2006 and 2007.</p>	
128		<p>From: ILGA-Europe Executive Board: This Conference agrees that ILGA should consider changing its Constitution in order to make it possible for those people who do not identify as men or women, or identify as both, to stand for the Executive Board of ILGA without having to "choose" a gender to represent. We think there should be space for non-gender specific self-perceptions in ILGA and its Constitution, if anywhere in the world.</p> <p>This Conference therefore agrees that the Executive Board shall in time for the next ILGA Conference present proposals for changes to the Constitution and Standing Orders that reflect these principles.. The Board might promote further discussion among members on this issue to find the best practical solution to the issues raised here.</p>	<p><i>ILGA's Constitution requires all nominees standing for the Executive Board to identify themselves as either women or men. ILGA-Europe asks ILGA to consider changing its Constitution in order to make it possible to stand for the Executive Board of ILGA without having to "choose" a gender to represent..</i></p>

129		<p>From: Nordic Home Council, Sweden: The conference agrees that ILGA and its members should strengthen and emphasise culture created by LGBT persons as a powerful weapon against homophobia and silence by:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Including a workshop on international rainbow culture at all ILGA world conferences; 2. Present ILGA during cultural gatherings; 3. That ILGA and its members make greater use of the possibilities of the International Lesbian & Gay Cultural Network (ILGCN) and the Nordic Homo Council. 	<p><i>This proposal replaces the original text in the first mailing.</i></p> <p><i>Point 2.: This can be gatherings like conferences of ILGCN, the festivals in exile for Belarus, festivals of Amnesty International, GALHA etc.;</i></p> <p><i>Point 3.: ILGCN has secretariats in Sweden, Estonia, UK and USA. It has many contacts that could be of service in arranging festivals and conferences or providing cultural workers for international events.</i></p> <p><i>The NHC is a network of cultural workers and activists, based in Sweden, with members from Iceland to Latvia.
